RATIONALE

WHOLE SCHOOL

- High quality teaching
- Early identification of barriers to learning with specialist provision provided where needed.
- Intervention support to meet specific learning needs
- Free extra-curricular clubs.
- Active lunchtimes with supported play
- Access to pastoral care and family support (ELSA)

EYFS

- Support for new parents in phonics and teaching of early reading
- Parents invited to observe phonics lesson to inform them of how to support their child at home
- Resource bags provided to parents and children to support early reading and maths
- Blast programme to support confidence, listening and speaking
- 1:1 tuition from PP champion on early phonics, reading and writing (3X weekly)
- Additional support in whole class phonics teaching
- Extra visits/experiences for each topic
- Free extra curricular clubs
- Sticky fingers group to develop a good understanding of healthy eating and early cooking skills
- ELSA support for children as needed
- Nurture group provision-story and breakfast
- REAL Play resources and training for parents
- Extra Parents' evening appointments
- Music therapy sessions
- Attendance reviews

YEAR 1

- Model expectations for home support for reading / maths / phonics. Specific meetings for PP parents
- Resource bags for reading and maths provided
- 1:1 tuition from PP champion, focusing on reading and target areas
- Additional phonics support to prepare for phonic screen
- Blast programme to continue where appropriate
- Book packs - topic books and key texts provided to pupils to read at home
- Extra visits/experiences for each topic
- Free extra curricular clubs
- Reading breakfast with ELSA- focus on social skills as well as enjoyment of reading (story sessions)
- REAL Play resources and training for parents
- ELSA support for children as needed
- Opportunity to take on the role of school council in KS1
- Extra Parents' evening appointments
- Play therapy sessions
- Music therapy sessions
- Attendance reviews

YEAR 2

- Resource bags for reading and maths provided
- Blast programme to continue if needed
- Book packs - topic books and key texts from English
- CGP SATs revision books provided and homework sessions
- Model expectations for home support for reading / maths / phonics. Specific meetings for PP parents
- 1:1 tuition from PP champion, focusing on reading and target areas
- Extra visits/experiences for each topic
- Violin lessons
- Free extra curricular clubs
