## FOSI

We are looking forward to lots of fun events organised by FOSI (Friends of School) this year, and will be using funds raised to provide visitors into school to support curriculum subjects e.g. Creative History will provide workshops for Y1 History unit-The Great Fire of London, and Y2 History-The Titanic. We will also use some of the funds to provide whole school experiences e.g. live music from the Bournemouth Symphony orchestra. ## The school day

The gate is closed at 8:55 each morning, as this is the time at which school starts and registers are taken. Any child who arrives after the gate has closed, must be signed in at reception. Classroom doors open at 8:45, when children go in and complete their morning jobs. Please try to ensure that your child arrives at 8:45 am as lessons start promptly at 9:00 and late children miss out on the start of a lesson.

Our school day currently finishes at 3pm.

As per the guidance from DFE, we are planning to increase the length of our school day from <u>January 2024. All schools should, under their guidance, aim for a 32.5 hour week, which we are currently below.</u>

As an infant school, we are currently liaising with Sholing junior school, working together on this to ensure that times align and work for parents. Our current intention is to add time to the end of the school day rather than make an earlier start, but we will keep you posted and inform you as soon as possible as to the new school day hours.

Children may bring bikes and scooters to school -please store your child's bike/scooter on one of the racks provided. Please ensure that your child dismounts once through the school gates to avoid accidents.

## School entrance/exits

May we ask all parents to please enter the school through the Heath Rd gates. Exit may be back through Heath Rd or via the Middle road gates. The pavement is very narrow on Middle Rd and parents queueing/waiting to enter will create congestion. Oasis Sholing kindly stopped their students and parents entering on Heath Rd to help the infant school avoid congestion. Our exit gate was very much to support Oasis Sholing using the Middle road exit to their school. The Highways agency also allowed use of the gate only as an exit gate for us. Thank you for your cooperation.

## Attendance

Please ensure that your child attends school each day unless ill- if children miss school, they miss out, not just in terms of their education, but also in terms of their friendships, their emotional wellbeing and the relationships they make, also, in terms of their enjoyment of all school has to offer!

We know that children inevitably experience childhood illnesses, especially in the winter, so are, of course, understanding of this, but please be aware that we can, with your consent, give medication if children are just a little under the weather with a cough or cold. Please let the staff in reception know if your child needs medicine, completing the relevant permission form.

We are aiming for every child to achieve attendance of at least 96.5% as we know that children with high levels of attendance, achieve well and engage well

You can see your child's attendance on MCAS – it is a live record of your child's attendance. Children will be awarded certificates every term, for attendance of 96.5% or above.

Class attendance is announced each week in celebration assembly with a cup and prizes for the winner.

Please ensure that you contact the school before 9am if your child is ill and will be absent from school. Should school not hear from you, we will contact you as a safeguarding procedure to find out why your child is absent. Should we not be able to make contact with you, Mrs Harris, our Family Support link will do a home visit.

Should you require any support with your child attending school, Mrs Harris is also your first port of call, just email her – <u>j.harris@sholinginfantschgool.org.uk</u>

Please remember that we are not able to authorise holidays during term time and a Penalty Notice will be issued.

All schools are required to have an attendance action plan to ensure that high levels of attendance are maintained. Our plan is published , alongside our policy on our website , for your information.

### Safeguarding

If you ever have any concerns regarding the safety or well-being of our children, please contact the school to speak to Mrs Houghton (Designated Safeguarding Lead) or Mr Steward (Deputy Safeguarding Lead). The safety of our children is the responsibility of us all. Our Child Protection Policy has been updated in line with the September 2023 guidance and is published on our website for your information.

Our PSHE curriculum includes half termly topics on 'safety' ensuring that we teach children how to stay safe in a range of contexts. This half term we are teaching the children all about 'body safety'. We will be using the NSPCC PANTS video and related resources. These are on the NSPCC website if you want to take a look. Miss Gardner is our PSHE lead. Please contact her if you want further information, or take a look at our website to find out more about our safety curriculum.

### Esafety

Keeping children safe online is another important part of our safeguarding work at Sholing Infant School. It can be very difficult to ensure the safety of our children online, but, by setting parental controls on devices or

### Influenza vaccinations

Solent NHS Trust is again offering nasal influenza immunisation to pupils in all year groups in school. This will take place on 29 September 2023. Information and consent forms will be sent home in due course. The vaccination is painless and the vast majority of parents took up the free vaccination last year. However, the decision is made by parents and <u>NO child will be vaccinated unless the NHS</u> <u>Trust has written consent from parents.</u>
