Online Reporting

One of the funding requirements for the PE and Sport Premium is that schools must publish details of how they spend their allocation.

This must include:

- The amount of premium received.
- A full breakdown of how it has been spent (or will be spent).
- The impact the school has seen on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment.
- How the improvements will be sustainable in the future.

The 5 key indicators to see improvement across are:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity the recommended guidelines is at least 60 minutes a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school.
- The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement.
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- Increased participation in competitive sport.
